



USS Lloyd Thomas Westpac Cruise '70



Lieutenant (junior grade) Lloyd Thomas, USN

Lloyd Thomas was born on March 10, 1912 in Nelsonville, Ohio. He graduated from Ohio University in June of 1935, became an aviation cadet on October 4, 1938, and received a commission as an Ensign in the United States Navy on October 26, 1939. He joined Torpedo Squadron Six on board the USS ENTERPRISE on December 13, 1939, and was promoted to Lieutenant (junior grade) one year later. He gave his life in his squadron's attack during the Battle of Midway, and was posthumously awarded the Navy Cross with the following citation:

"For extraordinary heroism and courageous devotion to duty while piloting an airplane of Torpedo Squadron Six in action against enemy Japanese forces in the Battle of Midway on June 4, 1942. Participating in a vigorous and intensive assault against the Japanese invasion fleet, Lieutenant (junior grade) Thomas pressed home his attack with relentless determination in the face of a terrific barrage of anti-aircraft fire. The unprecedented conditions under which his squadron launched its offensive were so exceptional that it is highly improbable the occasion may ever recur where other pilots of the service will be called upon to demonstrate an equal degree of gallantry and fortitude. His extreme disregard of personal safety contributed materially to the success of our forces, and his conduct was in keeping with the highest traditions of the United States Naval service."

Lloyd Thomas was entitled to the ribbon and facsimile of the Presidential Unit Citation awarded the USS ENTERPRISE for distinguished achievements from December 7, 1941 to November 14, 1942. He was also entitled to the Purple Heart Medal, the American Defense Service Medal (Fleet Clasp), Asiatic-Pacific Campaign Medal, and the World War II Victory Medal.

The Ship

Construction of the United States Ship honoring Lloyd Thomas was authorized on July 9, 1942. The keel was laid in San Francisco, California, by the Bethlehem Steel Company on March 26, 1944. The USS LLOYD THOMAS was launched on October 5, 1945, and commissioned as a general purpose destroyer March 21, 1947.

LLOYD THOMAS is 390 feet long and 41 feet wide, with a maximum draft of 21 feet, design displacement of 2391 tons, and full load displacement of 3477 tons. Four boilers deliver steam to two geared turbines that furnish 60,000 horsepower to twin screws capable of maneuvering the ship at over 30 knots. She is manned on this cruise by 15 officers and 270 enlisted men. The primary weapons are anti-submarine, and two twin 5-inch, 38-caliber gun mounts are carried for shore bombardment and defense against air, land, and surface attackers.

In 1948 LLOYD THOMAS joined a round the world goodwill cruise starting in San Diego, California, transiting both the Suez and Panama Canals, and covering 45,168 miles. Following conversion to an escort destroyer in 1949 in San Francisco, LLOYD THOMAS was transferred to Newport, Rhode Island. In the years between 1949 and 1961 LLOYD THOMAS made one South American cruise, two European cruises, and six Mediterranean deployments, one of which included numerous port calls east of the Suez Canal. From October 1958 through March 1961 LLOYD THOMAS was an element of Task Group Bravo, an anti-submarine hunter-killer group.

LLOYD THOMAS received a fleet rehabilitation and modernization overhaul (FRAM-II) at the New York Naval Shipyard in 1961. This was followed by one European cruise and four deployments to the Mediterranean, three of which included extensive operation with Middle East forces. During these years LLOYD THOMAS served as host ship for an America Cup race in Newport, saved a fishing trawler flooding off of Boston, tracked a probable Soviet submarine for eight hours in the Mediterranean, and won both the Squadron Battle Efficiency Award and Departmental Excellence Awards twice within three years. Late in 1968 the ship lost a large percentage of its crew and entered a reduced operational status. LLOYD THOMAS returned to full operational status in 1969 and in April 1970 changed home port to Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, and began preparations for the WESTPAC deployment chronicled in this cruisebook.

The Captain

Commander Leo Paul Brown, USN, enlisted in the Navy in June 1948. He served aboard USS Hugh Purvis (DD-709) and on the Staff, Commander Military Sea Transport Service, Eastern Atlantic and Mediterranean Area in London, England, before entering Naval Officer Candidate School at Newport, Rhode Island in May 1955.

Commissioned an Ensign in September 1955, he subsequently served aboard USS Dortch (DD-670) as Communications and CIC Officer until September 1957, and on the Staff, Commander Destroyer Division One Twenty-two as Division Operations Officer until September 1958. He then reported for duty as Commanding Officer of the auxiliary ocean tug USS Umpqua (ATA-209) which he commanded until February 1960.

Commander Brown completed the ten month General Line course at Monterey, California in December 1960 and was assigned to the Bureau of Naval Personnel as a Branch Head of the Enlisted Services and Records Division (PERS-E3). This was followed by duty on the Staff, Commander Service Squadron Six (Commander Service Force Sixth Fleet), homeported in Naples, Italy, where he served as Force Communications Officer from January 1963 to November 1964. Commander Brown returned to Monterey in January 1965 for additional studies, and was awarded a Bachelor of Science Degree with a major in Business Administration in December 1966.

From Monterey, Commander Brown joined USS Black (DD-666) for duty as Executive Officer, serving in that capacity until October 1968. Prior to reporting aboard LLOYD THOMAS he was assigned to the Staff, Commander United States Military Assistance Command, Saigon, Republic of Vietnam, where he served as a member of the Joint Staff Secretariat.

He is married to the former Bernice Boiteux-Buchanan of London, England. They have two children: Clifford Lee, 15 and Leslie, 12.
